DiCaprio brings his pet cause to the big screen



LEONARDO DiCAPRIO HAS LONG BEEN one of Hollywood's most private citizens. But there is one thing the Oscar-nominated actor is more than willing to discuss: the environment. DiCaprio, 32 (who dates model **Bar Refaeli**, 22), spoke with *Us* at France's Cannes Film Festival about *The 11th Hour*, the documentary on global warming he coproduced, cowrote and narrates.

Q: Was it difficult to sum up this subject in a film?

Yes. These are complicated issues and cannot be put into a format of digestive baby food that is spoon-fed.

Q: What can Americans do to help?

They can vote with their dollars. Purchase from companies that have come up with alternatives for the future. Look at the Toyota Prius. [Its success] has shown automakers that there is a demand for alternative vehicles. And now the auto industry knows that we

cannot go on with business as usual with gas-guzzling vehicles.

Q: People sometimes dismiss celebrities getting involved with issues.

I am completely aware of the fact that my mere attachment — being someone from *Hollywood* — will garner a certain amount of skepticism and criticism. Why should we listen to this person? I want to pose myself as a concerned citizen, not an expert.
