NYU Langone Health's [Ronald O. Perelman Department of Dermatology](#) and [Perlmutter Cancer Center's](#) Community Outreach and Engagement Program are partnering with [The Skin Cancer Foundation](#) to offer free skin cancer checks to adults in South Brooklyn over the weekend of May 17 and May 18.

Dermatologist [David Polsky, MD, PhD](#), the Alfred W. Kopf, MD, Professor of Dermatologic Oncology at NYU Grossman School of Medicine, and a team of dermatologists and medical professionals will be conducting the screenings.

Both events will take place from 10 am to 4 pm in South Brooklyn, which has a large Russian-speaking community. Dr. Polsky and colleagues in the [Department of Population Health](#) have identified this population as being more likely to be diagnosed with advanced-stage melanoma than patients from most other New York City communities.

Russian-speaking medical professionals will be present at both events. Perlmutter Cancer Center's Stamp Out Cancer Community Health Workers collaborated on both events and will continue to help bring skin cancer awareness to the community.
